Social Philosophy

- Dewey; Reconstruction in Philosophy. Holt, 1910. Lectures delivered in Japan which set forth Dewey's views with unusual clarity. He contrasts philosophy as an attempt to organize and interpret human experience with the closed philosophical system of former days.
- Dewey; Human Nature and Conduct. Holt, 1922. Social psychology according to Dewey. A "must" book.
- Mead; Mind, Self and Society. Univ. of Chicago Press, 1935. Students' notes of Prof. Mead's lectures collected and edited after his death. Difficult reading but important.
- Hocking; Human Nature and Its Re-making. Yale Univ. Press, 1923. Outstanding for its psychological understanding and moral insight. A "must" book.

Psychology of Religion

- Coc; Psychology of Religion. Univ. of Chicago Press, 1916. Still the best all around book in this field.
- James; Varieties of Religious Experience. Longmans, 1902. One of the classics. It should be in every minister's library and in his mind.
- Starbuck; Psychology of Religion, Scribners, 1898. A pioneer study concerned chiefly with the religious conversion experience. Its findings are still valid.

Psychopathology

- Fraud; Autobiographical Note. Brontano's, 1926. The great founder of psychoanalysis gives here a fascinating account of its origin and development.
- Fraud; Introductory Lectures: First Series. Boni & Liveright, 1920. The best setting forth of psychoanalytic doctrine, before the "super-ego" appeared.
- Alexander; Psychoanalysis of the Total Personality. Nervous & Mental Disease Publishing Company, 1930. Psychoanalytic doctrine with special emphasis upon the concept of the "super-ego" and of the need for punishment.
- Jung; Modern Man in Search of a Soul. Harcourt, Brace, 1933. Lectures and essays by an excommunicated psychoanalyst who is especially interested in the religious aspects of his special field.
- Campbell; Destiny and Disease in Mental Disorder. Norton, 1936. A modern view of mental illness by a distinguished representative of the "American School"
- White; Foundations of Psychiatry. Nerv. & Ment. Dis. Pub. Co. 1921. A consideration of the biological, sociological and psychological meaning of mental illness.
- White; Forty Years of Psychiatry. Nerv. & Ment. Dis. Pub. Co. 1933. A history of American psychiatry in autobiography.
- Hart; Psychology of Insanity. Macmillan's, 1912. A brief, inexpensive introduction to the psychology of mental illness which is still unexcelled.
- Wise; Religion in Illness and Health. Harper's, 1942. Contains an excellent chapter on the emotional factors in physical illness.
